Afraid to report something to the Police?

As a citizen of Woking there is an expectation on you to report incidents and crime to the Police, but not everyone feels they are able to do that. You may be in a personal or family relationship where reporting anything to the Police would be difficult. Or you may feel that what you report may be traced back to you, with unfortunate consequences for you or your family.

But there has been an alternate available for quite some time. It is called CrimeStoppers.

This charitable organisation (not funded by the government and so does not have to take orders from them) will take calls from anyone who wants to report a crime or incident but who also wants to remain 100% anonymous. Crimestoppers guarantees that the caller's details, or anything that may help identify them, will NEVER be included with the report. They have a 100% record in reporting anonymously. Not a single caller to CrimeStoppers has been able to be identified by the Police. 0800 555 111.

So, if you want to report something anonymously about drug dealing, violence against women and girls, modern slavery, domestic abuse, human trafficking, etc then CrimeStoppers is ideal. It may well be you who is the victim. 0800 555 111.

As with any serious crime, it is important to report immediately so that the details can be passed on to the Police in a timely manner and to "catch the moment". CrimeStoppers will takes calls in any language, so just tell them what language you speak when you get through on the phone. If you want to call 999 for the Police but are not able to speak at that moment, there is a Silent Solution whereby the Police will understand that you cannot talk and so will deal with your call appropriately.
